Grading:

Academic standing and eligibility for a degree are determined by the quality of course work. To determine academic standing, Berklee Online uses a point system, each qualitative grade having an equivalent numerical value.

How the Grade Point Average is Calculated:

Each letter grade has a grade point equivalent as listed. To calculate GPA, multiply each grade point equivalent by the number of credits for each class, total all products, and divide by the number of credits from all graded courses. GPA's are unweighted.

Dean's List:

Students averaging honor grades for any given semester are placed on the Dean's List. Specific criteria for inclusion on the list are as follows:

Undergraduate:

Students must earn at least 6 credits in the semester in consideration and achieve a grade point average of 3.60 or above. No grade lower than a B+. and no grades of Incomplete ("I") or Withdrawal ("W") are permitted.

Graduate:

Students must earn at least 6 credits in the semester in consideration and achieve a grade point average of 3.80 or above. No grades of Incomplete ("I") or Withdrawal ("W") are permitted.

Graduate Graduation Honors:

Master's students who complete their program with a cumulative GPA of 3.8 and above will graduate with distinction.

Academic Year:

Berklee Online has four intensive semesters per year: Fall, Winter, Spring and Summer. Each semester is 12 weeks in length.

Credit System

Berklee Online operates under a semester-hour system.

Definition of a Credit Hour:

Students earn 1 course credit for every 15 hours of instruction over 12 weeks. There is also the expectation that 15 hours of instruction require 30 hours of additional course work over 12 weeks.

Prior Learning

Through prior learning credit, students can earn up to 30 credits toward the Bachelor of Professional Studies degree program. Courses awarded through prior learning are not issued grades.

Course Numbers:

Starting in the Summer 2014 semester, Berklee Online changed the course numbers of all courses to more closely reflect the type and level of each course. Courses taken prior to this time will reflect the original course numbers.

- ❖ Graduate Certificate (requiring a minimum of 9 credits)
- ❖ Master Certificate (undergraduate certificate requiring between 24 and 36 credits)
- ❖ Advanced Professional Certificate (undergraduate certificate requiring between 24 and 36 credits)
- ❖ Professional Certificate (undergraduate certificate requiring between 9 and 15 credits)
- ❖ Specialist Certificate (undergraduate certificate requiring 9 credits)
- ❖ Individual courses for credit or non-credit
